The Longitudinal Small Business Survey of 2023 (LSBS 2023) is a large-scale, UK-wide telephone survey of SME employers commissioned by the Department for Business and Trade and the devolved administrations. The main aims of the survey were to monitor key enterprise indicators, gauge SME employer intentions, needs and concerns, and the obstacles to fulfilling their potential. The following report is a summary of the findings specifically related to SMEs with at least one employee in Northern Ireland.

Business Population Estimates

The 2023 Business Population Estimates calculated that there were 122,095 businesses in the NI private sector. Sixty eight per cent of these businesses had no employees - and are not included in this analysis.

Retail/wholesale - 21%




Construction - 15%

77% were family-owned (UK=**75%**)





Numbers employed 12 months ago compared to now




Numbers of people expected to be employed in 12 months time

Expectations of turnover in 12 months time




Exporting





13% of NI SME employers have introduced new or significantly improved goods in the last 3 years (UK=15%).




24% of NI SME employers have introduced new or significantly improved services in the last 3 years (UK=**26%**).

34% applied for a loan from bank or other


30% applied for bank overdraft

12% loan from family/friend




Amount of finance obtained





Percentage of SME employers seeking advice in the past twelve months






The main reasons for which SME employers sought information or advice in the past twelve months were:
