Exceptional Talent

Northern Ireland has a still **largely untapped pool** of culturally-compatible, highly-educated legal talent seeking quality legal roles in the region. The region boasts two of the top 20 law schools in the UK (The Guardian 2018).

Our legal talent pool includes an annual surplus of some 500 law graduates as well as an **experienced cadre of professionals** who are keen to return and re-locate to the region.

Added to that, a pipeline of almost **3000 talented STEM graduates,** and programs in place to build the next generation of tech-savvy lawyers mean that progressive firms and legal tech entrepreneurs are attracted to the region as a **hub of legal innovation**. 70% of our IT and telecoms professionals hold a higher education qualification – the highest in the UK. Belfast is Europe's top destination city for new software development mobile investment.

NI government, industry and academia have a strong track record of collaboration in the region, to ensure the region's skills base meets the needs of employers. A range of **bespoke government**backed initiatives under the region's Assured Skills guarantee further boosts the talent pool.

Cost Competitiveness

Operating costs are **typically 20-30% lower** than in the rest of the UK and Europe.

Typical operating costs for a legal services center in Northern Ireland are around **50% less than London** and around **40% less than New York**.

Software development labour costs in the region represent a reduction of around 30% compared to London and 25% compared to Dublin and staff attrition rates are consistently low.

Effective R&D costs in Northern Ireland are highly competitive. The combination of attractive incentives mean that for every £1 invested in R&D could cost a business as little as 50p. Northern Ireland has **some of the lowest prime office rental costs in Europe** – typically 75% less than London and 50% less than Dublin.

Innovative expertise

Both NI universities have **highly specialized ICT related research centers**, deeply influenced and embedded into real world applications with significant industry and cross-cluster engagement.

According to the Research Excellence Framework (REF), over 70% of NI university research activity is world-leading or internationally excellent.

Ground-breaking research from the region in **analytics, artificial intelligence and cyber security** is commercialized world-wide. Queen's University is home to the UK's largest research Centre for Secure IT (CSIT) and both universities are advancing the field of AI with dedicated research groups.

Collaboration is actively promoted in the region. The **Ulster University Legal Innovation Centre** - a legal tech research and educational collaboration between the School of Law and the School of Computing- is supported by Allen & Overy and Baker McKenzie.

Activity in **disruptive technologies** is growing. PWC Belfast has the largest group of blockchain specialists in PWC world-wide. Deloitte Belfast is developing 20 blockchain related prototypes.

The region has a low risk, pro-business environment with a local government committed to growing the legal cluster in Northern Ireland through:

- Practical on the ground support from Invest NI to facilitate location assessment and the development and implementation of investment plans.
